For the past 32 years, Cape Fear Literacy Council has partnered with thousands of volunteers, tutors, and generous supporters to provide small group classes and one-on-one tutoring services to adults in the Cape Fear region. Nearly 40% of adults in our region struggle with basic reading comprehension. CFLC aims to eradicate this statistic by offering targeted educational services. Executive Director, Yasmin Tomkinson, comments on CFLC's programmatic efforts, "At the Literacy Council, we are able to personalize instruction so that we can meet the specific educational needs of adults with diverse learning goals. We work with folks who want to brush up on their writing skills for a job, those who need to pass a math test, those who are just beginning to learn English, and everyone in between. We are deeply grateful for our dedicated volunteers and staff who make our good work possible."

## **Grant and Foundation Awards**

Cape Fear Literacy Council has enjoyed a successful First Quarter of 2017, with the following grant awards:

- CFLC received over \$15,000 through a capital improvement grant from the Landfall Foundation. These much-needed funds will allow the Council to replace the HVAC system in one of their two buildings.
- CFLC received a **\$2,000** grant award from the Catherine Kennedy Home Foundation for skill books for CFLC's learners who are 60+ years old.

- CFLC enjoyed generous support from local Rotary Clubs during the spring golf season –
  both the Wilmington East Rotary Club and Cape Fear Rotary Club designated CFLC as
  one of their beneficiaries for each of the clubs' long-running and popular golf
  tournaments. Collectively, Wilmington East and Cape Fear Rotary Clubs will donate
  \$6,500 to support CFLC's literacy efforts. Rotary Clubs worldwide have deemed Basic
  Education and Literacy Services as a critical humanitarian need and focus their support
  on organizations addressing literacy issues in their local communities.
- Additionally, the Council received a \$1,000 grant award from the Corning Foundation for support of the organization's Adult Literacy and English as a Second Language programs.
