During the 2021–21 Program Year, your Literacy Trust membership supported the 244 adults enrolled in our program **to achieve these high-impacted goals:**



IN DEPTH WITH THE ADULT LITERACY PROGRAM

We're proud to introduce Doug and Ted a student-tutor pair working together since 2019 to achieve Doug's goal of earning his GED. Their hard-fought success came this August.

Why did you feel it was so important to earn your GED? How does it affect your family?

DOUGLAS: I felt really frustrated with my lack of job prospects. Most employers won't even look at your resume if you don't have that credential. I want an actual career in a skilled trade and a chance to move forward, and the GED was the only way to get it. This is also so important for my kids. I want to set an example. My 12 year-old son is getting to the point where he doesn't like school, and I keep trying to tell him how important it is, and that he's got to stick with it. But how do I get onto him, if I haven't done it myself? He needs to see me do this - to work at it and actually complete it!



What are you most excited about accomplishing now that you have your GED?

DOUGLAS: I really want to apply to CFCC...I want a chance at a real career and a job with a future.

What would you say to a person who is on the fence about getting a GED - how would you encourage them?

DOUGLAS: I would say go for it! You're only going to better yourself; you have nothing to lose. People say sometimes when you're looking for a job that it's about who you know, but the truth is, it's also about what you know. You have to have that background, that knowledge, that diploma – you have to stick with it and do better by yourself. I've tried to get my GED on and off since I was 19. I've tried so many different times, so many different programs. I think what finally worked for me was having one-on-one support. Ted made all the difference for me. He was so patient and encouraging. He really explained everything, as many times as I needed it. His support helped me keep going and believe I could do it, and I wanted to do it for him, not just myself. My success is his success. If it wasn't for Ted and CFLC, this wouldn't have happened. I can't say thank you enough!

Tell us how you felt when your student passed the GED. Would you like to tutor more students who aspire to earn a GED? Why do you feel it's important?

TED: It was an amazing feeling when Douglas passed! I felt so happy for him. He'd worked so hard and kept going through so many challenges. He deserved to hit the finish line! It was all his hard work, but I felt really honored to be a part of it.

"At Cape Fear Literacy Council, much of our reporting to our supporters focuses on the progress made by our adult learners. In 2020, after a 6-year streak of cuts in Federal funding, CFLC saw an increase in federal grant awards that were not pandemic-related. Yasmin attributes much of this successful increase to Nancy, saying:

"Nancy is the singlemost capable and knowledgeable person for maintaining and utilizing our complex data and assessment systems. Funding is a very nuanced and compliance-driven process on the federal level, and Nancy has an incredible gift as a highly-organized systems thinker who can present key information about our students and program to illustrate the quality education we provide. I credit our increase in funding to Nancy's capabilities as a leader and data analyst."



Nancy has also been instrumental in the creation and successful growth of the Computer on Wheels (COWs) Program The COWs Program, which was established to bridge the growing digital divide in our community by providing a mobile computer lab, has seen much success because of partnerships with other nonprofits - reaching over 300 students since its inception. COWs is currently on hold because of the pandemic.

IN DEPTH WITH THE ESL PROGRAM

A New Eva for the Becoming a naturalized US Citizen can be complex, even for native English speakers, but rewards include a sense of security, better job opportunities, the right to vote, and college financial aid benefits. CFLC is the only free local resource to help eligible immigrants navigate this life-changing process.

program to target the three phases of an applicant's process:

- COMPLETE PAPERWORK: initial eligibility and fee waiver/reduction consultations, and filing comprehensive N400 paperwork. This requires digital literacy instruction/support, extensive fact-checking, and one-on-one consultations with each candidate.
- LEARN CIVICS CONTENT: there are 100 questions about US history and government that applicants may be asked. We provide instruction for the exact questions as well as background information for more robust understanding of context.
- PREPARE FOR SPOKEN AND WRITTEN TESTS: volunteers conduct mock interviews, provide dictation practice, and support conversational English skills so that applicants are familiar and comfortable with the examination experience.

"I passed my citizenship interview yesterday, May 20. Thank you for the HELP! Ms. Heather is a very good teacher, she helped me a lot." - Anna from Russia

"Yes, I passed! It was very easy. The person [who tested me] was nice and easy for me to understand. The interview YOU gave me was much more difficult!" - Ricardo from Venezuela

Since we re-structured our program three years ago, 71 immigrants have become naturalized US Citizens, and they have also secured 18 Proofs of Citizenship for their children. During the pandemic, we've had to rely on virtual, one-on-one instruction, but as public health requirements change – and with recent grant awards from the Landfall Foundation and International Paper – we look forward to resuming "Citizenship Sundays" to meet the needs of our community.

With her welcoming and caring personality, Lauren Rogers has transformed the ESL Program in the four short years she has been with CFLC. We met Lauren through our community partnership with the Interfaith Refugee Ministry, where she served as their Americorps Volunteer Coordinator. She began her career with us as the ESL Program Assistant and became the ESL Program Director in 2018, after we lost use of the ESL building due to Hurricane Florence. Even through natural disasters, Lauren worked tirelessly to serve our ESL Community and has left a lasting legacy for our new colleagues with these programmatic wins:



ESL CURRICULUM – Lauren devoted countless hours to updating our ESL curriculum materials to make them more accessible to students of all literacy levels and backgrounds. She developed 2 years of curricula that integrate state and national ESL content standards and can be adapted for in-person and virtual learning. This package is available in turn-key modules for any NC-based ESL program to purchase.



CITIZENSHIP – The Literacy Council's US Citizenship Preparation Program has seen more applicants and subsequent citizenship success stories than in any point in our 36-year history - see above for program highlights!



CUSTOMIZED ENGLISH CLASSES - Since 2019, CFLC offers local and regional employers customized, fee-based, industry-specific English language instruction to suit the needs of both the employer and employees.



CULTURAL SENSITIVITY AND COMMUNICATION STRATEGY WORKSHOPS – Since 2019, the Literacy Council has partnered with numerous local businesses and organizations to provide accredited professional development workshops that enable employees to have more effective communications with the ESL populations they serve.
