## YOUR IMPACT ON CFLC PROGRAMS



Your Literacy Trust membership allowed us to provide free and confidential instruction to **574** adults in the last program year - that is a **35-year record**! The students you have supported have a variety of educational needs; they range from non-readers or those with limited English language skills, to those who need just to brush up in specific areas - like computer skills, job-related training, or pronunciation. Your commitment supported the **14,000+** hours our students invested in their education! And they created results: **9 out of 10** students with sufficient hours made measureable progress in 2020.

"Since the quarantine, I've enrolled in an online program to become a medical interpreter! My one-on-one tutor helps me a lot with my homework [for that course] and my confidence in speaking up."



Did you know that your annual Literacy Trust gift supported **202** volunteer tutors in the 2020 program year? Another fun fact - **30%** of your fellow Literacy Trust Members are/were tutors. What a gift they all are to our students and organization! Our volunteer tutors are committed to our students - they complete **9-12 hours** of accredited tutor training, and typically log 2 sessions per week of either 1-on-1 tutoring or small group class instruction. Tutors utilize a multi-sensory approach to make content relevant to students' real lives and they provide instruction in a variety of coursework - Reading & Writing, English as a Second Language (ESL), Math, Test Prep, US Citizenship, and Digital Literacy. Our 2021 Tutor Trainings are now fully-digital.

Below you will find a very brief snapshot of some of the 'wins' our students

**ADULT LITERACY**: The Adult Literacy program was able to serve students by in-person appointments and virtually; and 98% with sufficient hours reported positive life changes or increased independence.

**ESL**: Even through the pandemic, this program served students from 44 countries and hours of instruction greatly increased: students had an average of 41.6 hours/student vs. 29 hours/student the previous year.

**DIGITAL LITERACY**: Even with the pandemic-based hiatus of the Computers on Wheels (COWs) program, 179 students increased their computer skills.

**US CITIZENSHIP**: 32 students became US Citizens – doubling the previous year's outcome (for the second year in a row!)

My student has had a stroke and due to health issues, does not want to meet in person, but we've been able to keep up with his studies just fine with FaceTime. He is doing great, and making rapid improvements with his vocabulary and spelling.

Your Literacy Trust investment was especially important in 2020, as it helped us to expand our literacy reach beyond the walls of CFLC with the following **community-based programs**:

**EMPLOYER-SPONSORED ESL PROGRAMS**: CFLC partnered with Johnson's Nursery in a fee-based pilot program; a tailored, on-site, ESL training program for their employees hoping to gain stronger English language skills. Coursework incorporated traditional ESL training with specialized training in nursery-specific vocabulary and concepts.

**BRIDGING THE DIGITAL DIVIDE**: During the pandemic, CFLC partnered with the Good Shepherd Center during the pandemic to assist shelter residents with the technology and necessary to apply for CARES Act Relief Funds.

**CULTURAL COMPETENCY TRAININGS**: Over the past few years, CFLC has partnered with NHRMC, Communities In Schools, and the NHC Senior Resource Center to provide accredited professional development workshops designed to enable social service providers, healthcare workers, and professionals to have more effective communication with the ESL populations that they serve.




# **NEW LITERACY TRUST INITIATIVE**

The new year brings a number of exciting changes to the Literacy Trust—including a change in the offerings for membership to this leadership giving group. After receiving feedback from dedicated supporters that they would be honored to be a part of this elite group of donors, but felt that a \$1,000 annual commitment for a 5-year period was out of their reach, the Literacy Council sought to create a proactive and inclusive solution.

We are proud to announce a new tiered-membership system for the Literacy Trust, effective this January, that widens the leadership circle to include a Silver Level (\$500 annually for a 5-year commitment), Gold Level (\$1,000 annually for a 5-year commitment—and the level where all current Literacy Trust members commit their support), and a Platinum Level (\$2,500 annually for a 5-year commitment).


